The role of human Papilloma virus Vaccination in Cervical Cancer prevention has been well establish but uptake has remained low. Parental health literacy is very important in targeting uptake of HPV vaccination as their role in the health care of their adolescents cannot be under estimated. Children in the age range

recommended for HPV vaccination are considered as minors who cannot make a decision by themselves. Therefore, cannot provide consent to vaccination and consent is normally required from their parent or legal guardian. Therefore, this study is targeting parents and their adolescents on issues relating to HPV knowledge and vaccination. It is obvious that without parental support uptake of HPV vaccination by adolescent girls for prevention of cervical cancer will be limited. It is collaborative study between Lecturers in The Department of Nursing, University of Ibadan and a Scholar from University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, Houston, Texas. This study will utilize quasi-experimental pre and posttest design. Data collection is in progress.

Combating mortality from cancer has remained major global challenge. Cervical cancer is one of the cancers in this category but can be prevented or reversed through early detection measures. Many developing countries like Nigeria do not have structured National Cervical Cancer screening programme thus most of the women reported report late with advanced disease. This implementation research seeks to integrate cervical cancer screening information and services into family planning services. This quasi experimental study is part Post Doctoral research sponsored by INDEN/STTI in Collaboration with University of Warwick, United Kingdom.

The researchers are group of multidisciplinary health workers, with backgrounds ranging from Community medicine, Medicine, Sociology, Obstetrics and gynaecology, Health promotion and education, Nursing, Psychiatry, Environmental health science, and Epidemiology and medical statistics who work together in identifying women health issues, develop proposals to assess the health problems and plan interventions that can be applied in small or large groups of women to solving fundamental health problems. The group strives to be a voice of the girl child, the female adolescent, the pregnant mother, the non-pregnant adult woman and the post-menopausal woman on various women's health issues through research that will produce data and support advocacy to improve women's health. Mental health problems are faced by many women as a result of pregnancy and child birth. This study seeks to investigate the factors contributing to this. Ethical approval has been obtained and field work has commenced.
