VIII. Details of Teaching and Work Experience

a) Undergraduate

- I. I have been involved in teaching duties to undergraduate students on clinical rotation in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology. The nature of the teaching included didactic lectures allocated to me within the departmental lecture schedule.
- II. I have taught the following specific lectures in the department, the concept of reproductive health including gender related issues, Amenorrhoea and polycystic ovarian disease, Climacteric and menopause, Ectopic pregnancy, including advanced extra-uterine pregnancy, Anatomy of the Pelvic Floor/Prolapse, Application of cytology to Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Carcinoma of the body of uterus and Fallopian tubes. Disease of Trophoblast and gynaecological tumour markers, Infertility, Nigeria's population dynamics and National development, Male and female surgical contraception, Overview of Maternity care: Preconception, antenatal, intrapartum and postnatal, Biological and social factors in obstetrics, Anaemia in pregnancy, Chronic pre-existing hypertension in pregnancy (including chronic renal failure), Rhesus isoimmunization, Acute renal failure in obstetrics and gynaecology, Diabetes mellitus in pregnancy, Low birth weight (preterm and IUGR), Psycho-social problems of pregnancy, Theories of onset of labour, normal and abnormal uterine action, prolonged labour, Mechanism of Labour and Management of Abnormal Labour, Induction of labour, prostaglandins, oxytocin infusion, Breech presentation and delivery: Conduct, hazards to the foetus, Malposition in labour; forceps delivery, vacuum extraction; episiotomy, Jaundice in pregnancy, Hypertensive disorders of Pregnancy, The puerperium; puerperal complications, Hormonal Contraception, and Malaria in pregnancy.
