### **VIII. Details of Teaching/Work Experience:**

Since my appointment, I have been involved in substantial teaching duties to clinical students in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at undergraduate level, and at the postgraduate level for the post-graduate diploma and masters programs. The duties include formal lectures, as allocated within the departmental lecture program. I also carry out tutorials and bedside teachings which involve demonstration of clinical signs and symptoms of various diseases to clinical students on the wards, clinics, accident and emergency unit and labour ward. I have supervised undergraduate group research projects for ten groups of final year students so far.

I am the course tutor on Reproductive Failure (OBG 713) and Assisted Reproduction (OBG 715) in the department's Masters (MHS and M.Sc.) programs. Our current trial is WOMAN-2 (of which I am also the National Clinical Lead).
